

# Chonnam National University



Founded in 1952, CNU has remained committed to fostering global leaders and professional as one of Korea's most innovative universities with a reputation for its research, teaching, and important role in local communities. Located in Chonnam province, southwest of Korea, CNU encompasses 16 colleges and 11 graduate schools. ## Gwangju

The City of Light: With a population of 1.5 million, Gwangju Metropolitan City is the fifth largest city in South Korea. Gwangju has consistently played an important role in the history of Korea's democracy and human rights movements. In particular, the May 18 Democratic Movement, in resistance against military rule, set an example for many Asian countries who are aspiring freedom and justice. The Nobel Peace Prize Laureate Summit and a Women's Forum in 2006 and 2007 respectively offered opportunities to raise awareness about the spirit of Gwangju, democracy, human rights, and peace around the world. Gwangju is also regarded as a city rich in culture and art, and there are always exhibitions and performances which make the city vibrant and colorful.



Gwangju is designated as an "International Safe Community" by World Health Organization (WHO).
