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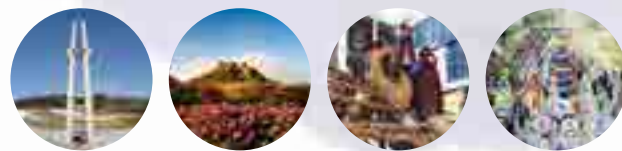

In particular, the May 18 Democratic Movement, in resistance against military rule, set an example for many Asian countries who are aspiring freedom and justice. The Nobel Peace Prize Laureate Summit and a Women's Forum in 2006 and 2007 respectively offered opportunities to raise awareness about the spirit of Gwangju, democracy, human rights, and peace around the world. Gwangju is also regarded as a city rich in culture and art, and there are always exhibitions and performances, making the city vibrant and colorful.



Gwangju is designated as an "International Safe Community" by World Health Organization(WHO).


