From 3rd to 10th July 2016, the Faculty of Arts at the University of Maribor will hold its 9th International Summer School. The title of this year's summer school is **ASPECTS OF MIGRATION: HISTORICAL AND CURRENT**. The lectures and workshops will focus on the current migration crisis, highlighting it from different perspectives, as well as provide an insight into the phenomenon of migration from aspects such as historical, geographical, cultural, literary, philosophical...

The summer school is open to undergraduate and postgraduate students of History, Geography, Sociology, Languages, Political Science, Philosohpy, Psychology, as well as to other students interested in the topic. The students will be awarded **3 ECTS** for the full participation in the programme.
